

**Marybeth Gasman, Ph.D.**

Dr. Gasman is an historian of higher education. Her work explores issues pertaining to philanthropy and historically black colleges, black leadership, and African-American giving. Dr. Gasman's most recent book is *Understanding Minority Serving Institutions* (SUNY Press, 2008). She is also the author of *Envisioning Black Colleges: A History of the United Negro College Fund* (Johns Hopkins University Press, 2007) and *Supporting Alma Mater: Successful Strategies for Securing Funds from Black College Alumni* (CASE Books, 2003).

Dr. Gasman has published over 100 articles and book chapters. Her research on Black colleges has been cited in the *New York Times*, *The Washington Post*, the *Wall Street Journal*, the *Chronicle of Higher Education*, *Diverse Issues in Higher Education*, *National Public Radio*, *U.S. News and World Report*, and *CNN*.

Dr. Gasman serves on research advisory boards for the United Negro College Fund and the Thurgood Marshall Scholarship Fund. She is also the chair of the American Association of University Professor's Committee on Historically Black Colleges and Universities.

In 2006, Dr. Gasman received the Association for the Study of Higher Education's Early Career Award. She is also the recipient of the University of Pennsylvania's Excellence in Teaching Award.
